

Biological Factors



- Individuals with family history -> 40-60% more likely!
 - Inherited brains that have altered brain chemistry
- Mental health disorders
 - o Depression, anxiety, ADHD, Bipolar disorder, etc.
- Onset during adolescence
 - Increases risk of long-term addiction
 - Killing the developing brain
- Gender Differences
 - Men= more likely to experiment
 - Women=more likely to be addicted






Psychological Factors

- Low self-esteem, poor self-image, feelings of inadequacy
 - -> can lead to make drugs look more appealing!
- Risky behaviors
 - Adventurous & curious -> more likely to try drugs







Environmental Factors

Chaotic or abusive home life

- Where drug use is normalized or modeled -> early exposure
- Lack of parental supervision during critical stage

Peer pressure

 Adventurous & curious -> more likely to try drugs

• Socioeconomic factors

- Poverty, unemployment, or housing insecurity
- Increases psychological strain & decreasing access to support systems








Statistics: Trends of Drug Addiction


Adolescents

- 12-25 due to risky, youthful behavior
- Susceptible to peer pressure
- Brain still developing: prefrontal cortex

• Demographic Shifts

- Addiction is increasingly recognized in older adults as well as younger people
- Rural and suburban areas are experiencing more problems, traditionally associated with urban centers
- Women's rates of addiction and overdose have been rising faster than men's in some regions.
