



Introduction to Illicit Drugs

- A substance that is either naturally produced, prepared from natural substances, or synthetic
- Largely classified into stimulants, depressants, and hallucinogens
- Laws around drugs are controlled by both Federal and state governments in the United States
- Placed in different Schedules based on their potential for abuse and medical use












Examples of Illicit Drugs

- Stimulants: increase brain activity, feel more awake, active
 - Nicotine, caffeine, amphetamine, cocaine, ecstasy
- Depressants: slows down brain activity, less stimulated, inactive
 - Xanax, GHB, alcohol, cannabis, ketamine, heroin, codeine, fentanyl
- Hallucinogens: affect senses, change the way you perceive senses
 - Cannabis, ketamine, LSD, psilocybin (shrooms)















Cocaine & Its Effects

- Top abused drug in the US (excluding alcohol, marijuana, and painkillers)
- Encompasses 40% of overdose emergency visit
- From Coca Leaves, about 8,000 yrs of history of cultivation
- Flush of Dopamine -> numbs senses -> stronger reliance and heavier doses
- Short High -> increases re-use rates: 15% of people who used cocaine became addicted to the drug within 10 years
- Affects Glutamate, a neurotransmitter -> impedes memory & learning
- Severe withdrawal symptoms: shakings, severe headache, fatigue
- Long term impacts: heart attack, strokes, etc





Heroin & Its Effects

- Synthetic opioid drug from morphine, from opium poppy plants
- Surge of pleasure, drowsy & slow breathing for several hours
- Severe withdrawal symptoms: restlessness, muscle & bone pain, diarrhea, vomiting, cold flashes, etc
- Users all at risk for overdose: never know the actual strength
- Long term impacts: kidney, liver, lung, mental diseases, HIV, hepatitis,
 - bacterial infections, etc
- Heroin can be used through injecting it in our bloodstream.







Fentanyl & Its Effects


- 80% for overdose deaths, the No.1 factor
- Synthetic opioid drug (x50 more potent than heroin -> high overdose risk)
- Binds into opioid receptors that control pain and emotions
- Brain adapts to drug, diminishes sensitivity & ability to feel emotions
- Causes extreme happiness, drowsiness, nausea, breathing problems, etc
- Severe withdrawal symptoms: muscle & bone pain, itching, severe
 - cravings, cold flashes, diarrhea, vomiting, etc





What's happening in your brain?



- Drugs affect the way neurons send, receive, process signals through neurotransmitters
- Neurotransmitters are norepinephrine, dopamine, and serotonin
- Cause activation of neurons / cause neurons to release large amounts of neurotransmitters
- Neurotransmitters get 'trapped' next to the receptors, so the receptors continuously send out signals
 - Overall, illicit drug amplifies or disrupts the normal communication between neurons











How to treat drug overdose? = Naloxone!



- Rapidly reverses opioid overdose
- Binds to opioid receptors
- **Blocks** the effects of other opioids, such as fentanyl, heroin, morphine, etc
- Effective within 2-3 minutes
- Accessible in CVS in all 50 states
- WISE will soon distribute free naloxone in Troy !!
